51%

of directors cite economic shifts as biggest board pressure

# How CEOs Can Respond

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1. **Condense financial decks to 3–5 pages of strategic insights, with optional appendix.**
  2. **Use dashboards to give directors real-time access to KPIs, forecasts, and risks.**
  3. **Craft board agendas around 2–3 strategic decisions—not 10+ status updates.**
  4. **Build a pre-read “What You Need to Know” summary for board members who skim.**
  5. **Use a board effectiveness survey after every meeting to improve performance.**
  6. **Track director read time, participation, feedback, and engagement over time.**
  7. **Build a strategic narrative—not just an update—around each meeting.**
  8. **Reassess your board’s composition and engagement annually.**
